


Our Holiday boutique was very successful! We raised over \$2000, so thank you to the suppliers and the buyers!!!!

Marie Tudor Converse McCook Henriques (1898 – 1986)

Marie and her husband, George Anson McCook had three children: Marie McCook (Cookie) Cooper, who was the mother of Bette Cooper's husband, John Cooper.

Her son, Anson McCook was married to Ann Nevins, later Ann Mudd and Ann Schneider. Ann was a Digger.

Her daughter, Julia (Judy), was married to Hancock Banning III (Bill) Banning. She was a Digger and so was her mother-in-law, Mrs. Hancock Banning, Jr. (Florence), and her sister in law, Mrs. Robert Banning (Joan).

Conservation - Carlin McCarthy



In January, 2024, the Diggers will join the NexTrex Recycling Challenge, which the Trex Company has hosted since 2006, with the goal of educating the public on the importance of plastic film recycling through school and community recycling programs. Trex recycles plastic bags into decking boards.

We will collect plastic film each month, weigh it and record it. If we collect 1000 pounds of plastic in a 12-month period we will receive a Trex bench, but larger garden clubs than we have not reached that goal, so we will be happy we are recycling plastic that otherwise would not have been.

I will take the collected bags to a participating grocery store with the plastic collection boxes. The stores prefer small, frequent deliveries of bags of plastic and may not accept bulk deliveries of bags.
